# Virginia's New River Valley Strategic Plan

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#### INTRODUCTION

The New River Valley Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) documents the region's economic development program to help continue federal and local partnerships address the economic development of the region. The CEDS process includes analysis, vision, action plan, and evaluation. This process provides a program that helps create jobs, foster a more stable and diversified economy, and improve living conditions in the region.

This annual report summarizes the changing conditions in the region during the FY 09 year. As a regional development strategy, Virginia's New River Valley Strategic Plan (Vision 2020: Community First, prepared in 2003) addresses the planning needs of the CEDS for the Economic Development Administration and the Area-wide Action Plan for the Appalachian Regional Commission. Figure 1 attempts a graphic depiction of the myriad of community and organization involvement necessary for the development of the regional strategic plan. Though no organization has this planning process as their central activity – strategic planning is a collaborative effort with all of these organizations and groups represented and actively engaged.

CEDS emerges from a continuous planning process. This Annual Report of the New River Valley CEDS seeks to document and evaluate the process, effectively updating the CEDS, while responding to the reporting requirements, review, and critique of the previous CEDS for the Economic Development Administration. Rather than a single stand-alone section, evaluation is integrated as a continuous feedback loop in each part of the process and report.

The CEDS Committee includes the Principles of the Investment Policy Guidelines in its project evaluation process. The Guidelines continue to be utilized in the development of CEDS projects.



Included in the FY09 work program was the preparation of the FY 09 major update of Vision 2020. The "new" CEDS, Community First... Regional Partners in a Global Marketplace, was led by the Commission and a Vision 2020 Steering Committee made up of 18 community and civic leaders. The process included six Community Conversations designed to reach out to "everyday" citizens on actual concerns of the region's citizens.

During the initial scoping of the update process by the Steering Committee it was determined the framework should be modified to include the categories of People, Business/Industry and Employment, Natural and Cultural Resources, and Physical Infrastructure. Goals, objectives, and strategies and projects were developed for each of the categories through the use of two questions:

- 1. What can be done immediately to shore up our local businesses, organizations and people?
- 2. What are the things we need to do today to support a bright future for our children?

The FY10 project priority listing in this Annual Report is also included in the "Regional Partners in a Global Marketplace" as the first year projects listing. The identified projects as well as others to be undertaken by participating agencies and organizations are focused upon achieving the goals identified in the CEDS.

#### ORGANIZATION AND MANAGEMENT

The New River Valley Planning District Commission (PDC) was created in September 1969 by the City of Radford, the Counties of Floyd, Giles, Montgomery, and Pulaski, and the Towns of Blacksburg, Christiansburg, and Pulaski. As key players in the regional economy, Virginia Tech and Radford University joined the Commission in July 2000 along with the Towns of Floyd, Narrows, Pearisburg, and Rich Creek. Twenty-four representatives of these entities make up the Board of Commissioners.

The PDC, as an Economic Development District, continues to serve as the CEDS committee for planning and economic development efforts in the New River Valley region. However, it works closely with several other regional groups that take leading roles in pursuing economic development projects and funding to advance the quality of life in the New River Valley (see Figure 1, page 4). These include the New River Valley Economic Development Alliance, the New River/Mount Rogers Workforce Investment Board, the Partners for Self Sufficiency (an organization formed by the local departments of social services in the region), Virginia's First Regional Industrial Facility Authority, the New River Valley Land Trust, and the Community Foundation of the New River Valley.


This spring, memoranda were sent to all the localities that participate in the New River Valley Planning District (PDC), and to collaborative partners. Each was asked to submit a list of projects that they were working on or considering. Then each group reviewed the status of current projects, and planning for the future. Staff at the PDC compiled the information for this report. The minutes of the CEDS Committee (PDC) meetings that were related to the CEDS are attached in Appendix I. New projects and programs emerged and were refined this year. These are included in this document. In addition to projects, the Goals and Objectives for the Vision 2020 process were updated. The updated Goals and Objectives are on the following pages, and the revised evaluation criteria are included in the Annual Project Package Report Section.

The staff for the CEDS Committee includes David Rundgren, Executive Director of the Planning District Commission, as well as Marty Holliday, Regional Planner and Jan Gilbertson, Information Systems Manager.

A list and description of the current CEDS Committee membership, and current letters/resolutions from each of the localities that have participated in and supported the planning process are also attached in Appendices II and III, respectively.

## Virginia's New River Valley VISION 2020

# "Community First...Regional Partners in a Global Marketplace" Updated May 2009

The New River Valley Planning District Commission (Economic Development District) leads the continuous planning process for economic development in *Virginia's* New River Valley region (known as "Community First").

A major update to *Vision 2020* was completed in 2003. The process started with a Celebration of the accomplishments in the Region since the 1995 version of the regional strategic planning document was prepared. Following the Celebration, meetings were held in each of the five jurisdictions. Additional public meetings were held around the specific goal areas. The partners involved in developing the update of the regional strategy included the New River Valley Regional Competitiveness Partnership, the New River Valley Land Trust, the New River Community Foundation, the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation along with the Economic Development District. Staff from these agencies served as a steering committee for the update process. During the updating process, the tag line "A Globally Competitive Community" was replaced by "Community First". The issue of competitiveness remains a very strong component of the development of the region. The new heading is driven by emphasis for putting Community First, ahead of reliance on outside markets and ahead of individual or organizational pursuits. We are in this together in the New River Valley and we need to find ways to build bridges across jurisdictional and programmatic lines.

During 2009 the Commission undertook the second major update of Vision 2020. There was considerable concern about the global economy, the decline in manufacturing, and the focus of education. "Community First" continued as a theme, however it was broadened into a regional context recognizing the need to be both a supplier as well as a consumer in the global marketplace. Vision 2020 has taken on its title as "Community First...Regional Partners in a Global Marketplace". Two major directions emerged: 1) Building a 21<sup>st</sup> century manufacturing economy regionally focused on nano particles and material science and 2) An education system with "career ladders" to build companies and their support regionally.

The Economic Development District works closely with localities and several regional groups that take key roles in pursuing economic development projects and funding to advance the quality of life in the New River Valley. The Goals and Objectives from the 2009 Vision 2020 update are presented here in the four interrelated categories of People, Business/Industry and Employment, Natural and Cultural Resources, and Physical Infrastructure.

#### Goals and Objectives

#### **PEOPLE**

The New River Valley sees its people as its greatest resource for economic sustainability. We recognize that in order for our area to be prosperous, our people must have the tools, resources, and education necessary to reach their full potential as citizens, workers and leaders.

Goal: To create educational programs that transcends school district lines to maximize available resources and eliminate inequity.

Objective: Use multi-media, distance learning and other technologies in the classroom to share

instructional resources and delivery and to access to information throughout the region,

focusing on duel-enrollment and AP programs.

Objective: Allocate resources equitably to ensure that students from all economic and basic skill groups

in school are prepared, encouraged, and ready to learn.

Objective: Encourage State recognition of the need for a funding formula fostering regional cooperation

among public schools in technology training and education.

Goal: To improve the Industry / Education interface at all levels.

Objective: To establish partnerships between industry/business and education by implementing an

integrated workforce curriculum that provides students with more "real world" learning opportunities and promotes the importance of skill development in order to prepare them to

compete in a global economy.

Objective: Provide nurturing environment to all children that stresses "employability skills" including

work ethic.

**Objective:** Expand mentoring and "shadow" programs.

Objective: Establish as an outcome of education and training programs preparation for business

ownership.

Goal: To increase literacy rates among the region's children and adults (90% with High School Diploma or equivalent).

**Objective:** Expand programs to teach basic literacy skills.

**Objective:** Offer more on-site literacy training opportunities to local businesses and industries.

Goal: To create life-long learning opportunities for New River Valley residents.

Objective: Expand educational curriculum, operating hours, use of technology, and location of

programming to offer non-traditional students educational opportunities to meet the needs of

all of the region's residents.

Objective: Provide affordable, diverse, and accessible continuing education opportunities.

## Goal: To train and re-train workers for higher skills and productivity in the 21st Century economy.

Objective: Train managers and workers to meet the current and future challenges of a competitive

marketplace.

Objective: Expand existing corporate training and professional development programs.

Objective: Encourage the "one stop career shop" to program services based on economic opportunities

of the region and geared to providing skills and assistance necessary to compete in the global

marketplace.

**Objective:** Implement an integrated workforce curriculum for 9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades to prepare students

for technical careers that will support the recruitment of high technology, bio-technology

and/or nano-technology industries to the New River Valley.

## Goal: To enhance and link the region's labor skills and technology advantages to improve wage levels.

Objective: Link local industries with technology and research capabilities of Virginia Tech, Radford

University, and New River Community College.

Objective: Expand the Virginia Tech Corporate Research Center's programs to include a strong

technology transfer component.

Objective: Encourage alternative education in vocational programs, marketable skills, including

business skills.

**Objective:** Market the region's specialty skill base to prospective industries.

Objective: Support research and development at all higher education institutions.

#### Goal: To foster inter-agency cooperation in the delivery of human services.

**Objective:** Devise an easily available system for the delivery of human services.

Objective: Strengthen client awareness of available services through better use of media, technology,

and volunteer care networks, and the grouping of social service agency representatives and

informational material within the one stop center.

## Goal: To provide affordable and accessible human services to all New River Valley citizens.

**Objective:** Make high quality services available in the New River Valley.

Objective: Target the needs of "high risk" persons of the region in order to allow greater participation of

these persons in the workforce and community.

**Objective:** Encourage and improve volunteer involvement in the delivery of human services.

## Goal: To create an affordable, accessible public transportation system for all citizens.

Objective: Coordinate and maximize the use of existing public and private transportation resources

focused on employment mobility.

Objective: Target and coordinate the expansion of currently available and on demand transportation

services to fill the needs of elderly, disabled, and disadvantaged citizens.

Objective: Plan and coordinate the expansion of the existing public transportation network to

incorporate the entire New River Valley.

Objective: Support volunteer-based transportation alternatives (e.g., Access to Rides).

Goal: To expand the region's child and adult day care network.

Objective: Support the development of an integrated network of private and public child and adult day

care providers to assist families twenty-four hours a day.

Goal: To ensure the safety of the region's citizens.

Objective: Improve the region's preparedness and ability to respond to natural crisis and man-made

emergencies.

Objective: Reduce police, fire, and Emergency Medical Service response times throughout the New

River Valley.

Goal: To provide youth programs and support:

Objective: Provide access to family basics training.

Objective: Encourage a system of after school programs (e.g., boys and girls clubs).

**Objective:** Support the provision of youth shelter(s).

Goal: To recognize and celebrate the emerging cultural diversity:

**Objective:** Recognize the cultural diversity that is the New River Valley.

**Objective:** Integrate emerging cultural diversity.

Goal: To train, inspire, support and deploy qualified leadership for all sectors and programs in the

region.

**Objective:** Support Leadership Development Programs.

**Objective:** Develop regional leadership organization and certification programs.

Goal: To establish youth involvement in the regional community.

**Objective:** Establish youth leadership training.

Objective: Seek youth participation in programs and provide recognition.

Objective: Create youth-specific seats on local councils, boards, and committees.

**Objective:** Create a Youth Entrepreneurial Center for business and civic development and practice.

Objective: Establish youth leadership recognition program.

Goal: To enhance public understanding of organizations and their functions.

**Objective:** Community awareness workshops for corporate leaders and elected officials.

Objective: Establish a mechanism to foster regional coordination among government agencies and

organizations.

Objective: Research and publicize non-profit and public contributions to community development

efforts.

Objective: Quarterly human service community meetings to discuss service delivery and system

constraints and promote community input and collaborative problem solving.

Goal: To promote and support organizational development and engagement in regional cooperation and collaboration.

Objective: Strengthen Non-profit corporate governance.

Objective: Promote local philanthropy to enhance community investment and commitment to local

development.

Objective: Support regional coordination within and between government agencies.

Goal: To assist in establishment of a regional system to protect the region's physical and economic security.

Objective: Encourage the training of law enforcement departments in Homeland Security.

Objective: Assist localities in meeting homeland planning requirements.

Objective: Support communication interoperability among first responders.

#### BUSINESS/INDUSTRY AND EMPLOYMENT

The New River Valley has a diverse economic base, from emerging high technology industries to traditional family farms, all of which need to be supported and developed so that they can continue to provide high quality jobs and regional investment.

Goal: To increase the number of jobs created through entrepreneurial start-ups and expansions in the New River Valley.

Objective: Organize creative financing programs and improve entrepreneurs' access to capital.

Objective: Strengthen the New River Valley's capacity to assist in the creation and expansion of

businesses that are competitive locally, nationally, and globally.

Objective: Support the business incubators, and their services to new businesses including the

development of corporate structures.

**Objective:** Business establishment as an educational outcome.

#### Goal: To increase the development and support of local family farms.

Objective: Develop educational and mentoring programs to support and encourage the continuation of

family farms.

Objective: Expand the availability of "farmers markets" for selling of local produce and farming

products (i.e. eggs, meats, wool, etc).

Objective: Develop and expand the availability of processing facilities for local farm products (i.e. eggs,

meats, etc).

**Objective:** Implement "Farms to School" programs, which would widen the market for locally grown

produce and products and provide our children with better quality food.

Objective: Incorporate into secondary and post-secondary agricultural programs opportunities for

learning about organic and "green" methods and technologies.

## Goal: To encourage "would be" entrepreneurs through education and enhanced opportunities.

**Objective:** Provide alternate educational opportunities and support to encourage self-employment.

Objective: Encourage and acknowledge entrepreneurial efforts in established local industries and

businesses.

Objective: Encourage home-based, community-based business zoning.

**Objective:** Explore the establishment of a youth entrepreneurial center.

#### Goal: Expand the use of green, bio, and nano technologies as a basis for entrepreneurial ventures.

**Objective:** Encourage the use of locally developed technology in manufacturing and other industry.

**Objective:** Support the development of E-commerce and business-to-business ventures.

Objective: Encourage the formation of programs to develop green/bio/nano technology based

businesses.

Objective: Broaden the availability of educational programs that support green/bio/nano technology

based business ventures.

Goal: To expand the region's economic base without compromising the high quality of life.

Objective: Recruit environmentally responsible companies that are utilizing green technology and

infrastructure.

Objective: Utilize appropriate land use controls and utility availability to direct business to appropriate

locations.

Objective: Develop and promote micro-business opportunities for recycled products to enhance local

utilization of recycled materials.

Goal: To improve the region's ability to market itself and respond to the needs of new industrial, research, and technological prospects.

Objective: Market the region's existing industrial, technology, and research space.

Objective: Expand multi-regional marketing campaigns involving the New River Valley Economic

Development Alliance, and similar organizations throughout Western Virginia.

Goal: To strengthen the economic position of downtown commercial districts.

**Objective:** Enhance the diversity of the region's shopping opportunities. **Objective:** Improve the competitiveness of downtown business districts.

Objective: Seek diversification and mixed use redevelopment of commercial districts.

Goal: To improve the customer service quality of local businesses.

**Objective:** Provide service instruction to employees.

Objective: Improve the region's ability to provide basic travel information to visitors through regional

collaboration on marketing initiatives and a regional website.

Goal: To improve the region's tourism development potential and ability to market itself as a tourism destination.

## Goal: To enhance the financial resources of local governments through tax restructuring.

Objective: Encourage the State to share income taxes and revenue growth with localities.

Objective: Encourage the state to allow more flexible local revenue strategies.

## Goal: To bring a voice to the policy table on behalf of the region.

Objective: Seek representation on State Commissions and Committees.

Objective: Provide input to State from regional economic development organizations and planning

districts.

## Goal: To improve the ability of local firms to strengthen industry relationships, access product and/or consumer markets, and become globally competitive.

Objective: Develop a "Corporate Team" program to encourage local businesses to work together to

pursue joint markets and/or federal contracts.

**Objective:** E-business support and development.

Objective: Develop regional marketing initiatives to promote New River Valley products to other state,

national, and international markets.

## Goal: To develop and strengthen the role of international trade and commerce in the economy of the New River Valley.

Objective: Coordinate with existing international trade promotion, training and networking

efforts/initiatives.

Objective: Market the advantages and promote the use of the Foreign Trade Zone and Customs Office

at the New River Valley International Airport.

Objective: Use Foreign Trade Zone status as a tool in recruiting new industries and diversifying the

New River Valley's economy.

## Goal: To improve the region's ability to support and respond to the needs of local industries.

Objective: Create a more supportive and open relationship between industry, government, and educational institutions

Objective: Utilize the Community College or the One-stop Centers to assist businesses seeking trained

employees or training of employees requiring enhanced skills.

Objective: Provide intermediary between industry and social services.

Goal: To improve the corporate profitability of existing firms in order to encourage capital investment and job creation.

Objective: Evaluate the opportunity to create a New River Business Development Fund within the

Community Foundation.

Objective: Create new financing opportunities for business/industry expansion.

Objective: Assist the commercialization of innovative technology and non-technology-based

enterprises.

**Objective:** Develop more value-added processes for products developed locally.

**Objective:** Encourage recruitment of local college graduates.

#### Goal: To develop opportunities with international firms.

**Objective:** Identify potential international partners for local firms.

#### NATURAL AND CULTURAL RESOURCES

The New River Valley is an attractive and desirable place to live, work, and visit.

Goal: To develop eco-tourism opportunities in the New River Valley

Objective: Design and market a series of travel packages for different recreational consumers.

**Objective:** Institute measures to protect critical areas from inappropriate development.

**Objective:** Inventory cultural sites and artisan shops throughout the region, and establish loop trails

off the Blue Ridge Parkway.

Objective: Develop nature-based recreational opportunities, including a network of trails for hiking

and biking.

Goal: To manage the impacts of future development in order to preserve the character and quality of the regional environment.

Objective: Improve land use planning and practices to preserve the region's rural character ensure

that critical or high risk areas are protected from inappropriate development.

Objective: Educate the public on the issues of land use planning and controls.

Objective: Encourage the development of recreational amenities in conjunction with all development

throughout the region.

**Objective:** Collaborate with the New River Valley Land Trust and other groups to educate

landowners regarding voluntary conservation easements.

Objective: Promote local comprehensive plans and zoning ordinances that support preservation and

conservation efforts.

**Objective:** Investigate program funding to assist in the cost of providing conservation easements.

Objective: Support existing agriculture and forestry operations and assist in developing alternative

agriculture opportunities.

Goal: To encourage regional recycling as a way to reduce demand for new or expanded solid waste facilities.

**Objective:** Continue public awareness of benefits and needs for recycling.

**Objective:** Develop convenient means to recycle throughout the New River Valley.

Goal: To increase the awareness of educational and cultural programs in the region.

Objective: Promote the enhancement of educational and cultural amenities, to include cultural

libraries.

**Objective:** Coordinate and cooperatively market local events regionally.

Goal: To develop activities and attractions that would better utilize the tourism potential of the New River Valley.

Objective: Identify, develop, and package the region's inventory of historical, cultural, natural

features, and events and market to outside markets.

Objective: Examine opportunities to attract travelers from the Blue Ridge Parkway.

Objective: Create and support a regional tourism agency/organization to promote the New River

Valley as a whole in partnership with each locality and other regional promotion

organizations.

Objective: Develop a blueway along the New River, regionally.

Objective: Seek inter-regional partnerships with other Virginia communities, West Virginia, North

Carolina, Tennessee, and Kentucky to enhance the region as a tourism destination.

Objective: Support creative economy highlighting skills endogenous to the Appalachian Mountains.

#### Goal: Encourage conservation of natural resources and develop alternative energy resources.

**Objective:** Evaluate the region for implementation of alternative energy developments.

Objective: Promote and support "green" development practices.

Objective: Develop a communication method/process by which all organizations/agencies that are

promoting and using conservation, green technology, and alternative energy sources can

share information with each other and the public.

Objective: Implement educational programs in the K-12 system that teach and promote conservation,

alternative energy, and recycling (like the NEED Program).

#### PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

The New River Valley has complete and quality infrastructure to support the goals, needs, and aspirations of the regional community.

Goal: To improve the capacity, condition, and efficiency of inter- and intra-regional transportation systems.

Objective: Seek the commitment of government and private interests to improve the capacity,

efficiency, and condition of the regional transportation network.

Objective: Increase the capacity and utilization of existing air service facilities in the New River

Valley.

Objective: Support passenger rail service for the New River Valley.

Objective: Increase interstate connections.

Objective: Seek opportunities to implement multi-modal services.

Objective: Seek to expand public transportation services and private transportation providers.

Goal: To ensure adequate, reliable, and safe delivery of all utilities in the New River Valley.

**Objective:** Interconnect water and sewer systems regionally where possible to improve reliability.

safety, and water quality.

Objective: Examine the potential of the New River as an alternative source of water for communities

using springs and wells.

Objective: Encourage AEP to build redundancy in electrical service to eliminate

blackout/brownouts.

Objective: Deploy a network of fiber optics throughout the region.

**Objective:** Establish a regional stormwater management and utility program.

Goal: To plan for the systematic construction, replacement, and repair of public infrastructure to meet future needs and ensure fiscal responsibility.

Objective: Encourage the development and updating of Capital Improvement Programs (CIP).

Objective: Seek creative and alternative funding sources for eligible capital improvement projects.

Objective: Seek creative and cooperative regional financing strategies for major infrastructure needs.

Goal: To improve the region's telecommunication network to attract new firms, assist existing firms, and educate citizens.

Objective: Complete Broadband linkage throughout the NRV (affordable broadband available for

every home and business).

Objective: Support and expand the New River Valley Wireless Authority to provide broadband

infrastructure and evaluate needs and recommend strategies to expand the community

network.

Objective: Promote the expansion and use of the "Electronic Classroom" at Virginia Tech, Radford

University, New River Community College and primary and secondary schools.

Objective: Pursue direct electronic links to marketing information and market sources for advancing

the region.

Objective: Establish a regional communications program for marketing and other outreach

programs.

Goal: To enhance regional solutions to solid waste disposal and recycling.

**Objective:** Reduce the amount of waste added to the waste stream.

Objective: Seek inter-and intra-regional cooperation regarding the disposal of solid waste.

**Objective:** Pursue markets for recycled and reused products and materials.

Goal: To assure that the region has an ample supply of affordable housing to meet the needs of people in all income ranges.

**Objective:** Adopt creative approaches to encourage the creation of affordable housing.

**Objective:** Promote the HOME program for providing low to moderate income individuals with

opportunities for affordable home ownership.

Objective: Determine appropriate and cost-effective means for providing shelter for all residents.

**Objective:** Seek to establish phased retirement centers.

Goal: To increase the region's supply of ready and available industrial and other economic development properties.

**Objective:** Coordinate and evaluate the development of the New River Valley International Airport

Goal: Increase mobility of the region's citizens, affordability.

Objective: Increase access to jobs from all parts of the region.

Objective: Create interconnectivity among transit and human resource transportation provides.

Objective: Enable access to encourage employee telecommuting.

Objective: System design should support the transportation needs of both citizens and visitors.

#### **EVALUATION OF PREVIOUS YEAR'S ACTIVITIES**

The 2009 Project Package represented the priorities of the region as of May 2008. It is, therefore, imperative to look again critically at that list. First, it is ascertained whether or not the project is still desired by the named agency. If not, it will be dropped from the new list. If the project is still desired (indicated by an "X" in the table), it is evaluated in terms of status (see **New River Valley 2009 Annual Project Package Evaluation**, page 19). The status categories of "planning, funding, and completed" are explained below. If a project has been completed or is fully funded, it will not be included in the 2010 Project Package.

## **Planning**

Planning, in this instance, is a general term used to indicate ongoing development of a project. This may include any of the following activities:

- □ holding project meetings
- □ studies including feasibility studies, engineering or architectural reports
- completion of required forms, permits, processes
- or any other activity indicating active pursuit of the project.

#### **Funding**

Funding is the critical yet often elusive component for bringing a project to fruition. The formal request for funding from Federal agencies is often a two-step process which begins with a preapplication. If the project is viewed favorably, the sponsoring agency is invited to submit an application. A project is considered "Funded" following award notification when grant agreements are completed.

#### Completed

A construction project is considered "completed" when the construction is entirely finished. A program (non-construction) is considered "completed" when it is implemented.

#### ADDITIONAL CONCEPTS FOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

Though many projects exist to support the identified Goals and Objectives, there are also supporting concepts that do not have specific projects yet. This section outlines some of those concepts. Many of these projects comprise an economic development approach that links directly into the *Community First* goals of having an optimum level of employment; an income level equal to or better than the state's average; and a beneficial living environment.

#### Leadership

The Leadership category highlights opportunities in the New River Valley for promoting and sustaining leadership development and engagement in our local and regional community. The following concepts do not currently have an active project associated with them but are in the process of partnership and timeline development.

#### Youth Business and Civic Leadership Development:

Provide hands-on training and mentoring opportunities through business and civic organizational partners in the program.

#### Youth Leadership Recognition Program:

Create award/program that recognizes and rewards youth leadership efforts in the civic and business sectors of the region.

#### Community Awareness Workshop for Elected Officials:

Establish short course for elected officials and corporate leaders highlighting community development issues and opportunities.

#### **Economic Development**

The arena of economic development showcases the New River Valley's approach to creating a sustainable, diverse regional economy that is also globally competitive. The following concepts do not currently have a project associated with them but eventually will in the future.

#### **Niche Development for Downtowns:**

Define downtown niches for cooperative marketing of unique characteristics of NRV downtowns.

#### Niche Farming:

Agri-tourism for a regional community of farmers.

#### Sustainable Agriculture:

Feasibility Studies of agro-tourism and providing outlets for locally-produced dairy products.

#### Explore approaches to expand public/private partnerships:

There are increasing pressures for the development of public/private partnerships to expand the public assistance in providing basic infrastructure to a more active role in the development of

corporations. The cost and risk involved in the formation of corporations has entrepreneurs seeking business acceleration assistance from the public sector. Defining and legitimizing this role is requiring innovation in establishing such partnerships.

#### **Education & Training**

In the area of Education and Training, the NRV has reached the critical point of needing to support workforce and education development programs aimed at establishing businesses and industries locally. With the economic crisis at the state and federal levels creating great inequities in service delivery, it is crucial that the New River Valley strategic plan for educational advancement be directed at building companies and a workforce for the global economy here at home.

#### Address the teacher shortage:

Develop incentives in collaboration with local governments, school boards and business sector to attract and retain qualified teachers to this area.

#### Address education funding:

Seek public/private partnerships and regional collaborations to offset state under-funding of education.

#### **Regional Educational System:**

Create New River Valley collaborative model to address alternative, advance placement and adult education needs in the region both physically and through the use of technology.

#### Health & Human Development

Health and human development put a personal face on the region's approach to supporting its citizens.

#### **Evaluate and Pilot Human Service Delivery Programs:**

Using higher education partners in the region, assess service delivery in the New River Valley and develop model for increasing effective and efficient service delivery.

#### **Quarterly Agency/Community Sessions:**

Create forum for community and human service agencies to gather and strategize ideas for higher efficiencies in service delivery and agency/client interface.

#### Natural & Cultural Environment

The Natural and Cultural projects represent the importance our citizens place on the often intangible aspects of quality of life that can make a place one that people are proud to call home.

#### Adopt-a-Stream:

Support for state-run program.

#### Baseline Wildlife & Habitat Inventory:

Build baseline landscape-level wildlife species and habitat inventory for the greater New River watershed.

#### Citizens' Water Atlas:

Develop a database for water resources, including threats in the watershed.

#### Compliance Study of Erosion and Sedimentation Control Practices:

Examine compliance rates of erosion/sedimentation control practices.

#### **Erosion Control:**

Educate landowners on erosion control and restoration of eroded areas.

#### **Support and Promote Christiansburg Institute:**

Assist in funding and program development to support this important historic and cultural asset of the region.

#### Regional-link Trail System:

Create prioritized map of trail connections to link all alternative transportation pathways in the New River Valley.

#### **Physical Infrastructure**

A sound physical infrastructure is the base on which all other projects are built. There are many needs in the area of physical infrastructure including **water and sewer** as well as **technology** infrastructure. Beyond these needs, additional concepts for physical infrastructure are listed below.

#### Bikeway Network:

Plan and create a network of bikeways through the NRV that connects towns, scenic areas, and historic areas.

#### Regional Civic/Convention Center:

Create event/conference center to provide space for large attractions and events.


#### **EVALUATION: AN INTEGRATED APPROACH**

As is apparent throughout this document, evaluation is an integrated part of the CEDS process. Given the continuous nature of this planning process, integration of evaluation into every step is one method of assuring a self-adjusting, constantly "fresh" plan and process. (See Figure 2) Important questions that are asked along the way as part of a feedback loop include:

- □ Has the situation changed?
- □ Are new partners needed?
- □ Do Goals, Objectives, and Projects need to be changed in light of current Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT)?

This process is followed annually as the CEDS is reviewed and the Annual Reports prepared. Goals and Objectives as well as projects are evaluated.

#### **Evaluating Completed Projects**

Following completion of a project, it is desirable to measure the effectiveness of the project and more specifically the return for the money spent. While larger goals such as a diversified economy, higher wages/incomes and improved quality of life are not easily detectable as they may be affected by most single projects, there are measurable related outputs. These include data such as number of jobs created and amount of private investment generated directly and indirectly. Please see **Project Evaluations**, Appendix IV.

#### **Cautions and Concerns**

While this is a straightforward query, answers are not so simple nor easily obtained. These projects do not take place in a laboratory where all external factors are controlled; rather each project is but one small part of countless variables in a huge picture that is the global economy. Moreover, the sum of a program of well-developed, mutually supporting projects is much greater than the sum of the parts.

For example, singularly developing a Regional Educational System to address alternative and advanced placement students needs regionally would not necessarily help incomes or unemployment in the region. Singularly developing a large Commerce Park to attract high tech industry will not help local economies if it sets idle. However, if a well-trained, well-educated work force is developed and physical space and infrastructure is available to high tech firms simultaneously, the likelihood of significant positives outcomes is great. Therefore, a truly integrated economic development strategy with multi-dimensional projects and components cannot be accurately measured in a single dimension. A means of simultaneously measuring relationships and synergies must be developed. A better question in many instances may be, "Is a good new piece of the puzzle now in place?"

Another difficulty in measuring outputs is that the timing is uncertain. In some cases, the greater the potential reward in the end may require a longer timeframe.

One of the most significant limiting factors in evaluation concerns the collection of data. To truly account for the success of a program would require tracking every single action and following that action to its subsequently induced actions and so forth. Even an attempt to keep track of "simple" items such as "jobs created" is a laborious process that takes time away from new project development, administration, etc. Evaluation and assessment is an important part of any project and in order to continue success and progress it must be built into every effort. Understanding the necessity of this effort and making it a seamless part of the project rather than something tacked on at the end is the goal of the integrated evaluation approach.

Lastly and related to the multi-dimensional discussion above, even if time is invested in tracking jobs and investments associated with a project, the data is not necessarily valid outside its immediate context. The whole purpose of a regional strategy is to recognize the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats within the region and to develop a unique program of projects for that situation. Unless the entire program is captured in a multi-dimensional way, the data is not well aggregated to the federal level.

The Giles County Board of Supervisors strongly endorses the economic development planning activities currently being conducted by the New River Valley Planning District Commission. These efforts benefit all the county and municipal jurisdictions within our region and area, which are possible only as a result of the funding support received from the Economic Development Administration.

The county is working with the PDC and local transportation providers to study the feasibility of offering public transportation for our citizens from Giles County into Montgomery and Pulaski counties. PDC support was also vital in the construction of a water system along the Rt. 100 corridor. This system is supplying drinkable water to citizens as well as enabling that area to be developed in the future.

Giles County is also working on several other projects that will be beneficial to the overall economic development of the area. Wheatland EcoPark is the development of a unique type of ecological friendly industrial park in the Eastern portion of the county. All facilities constructed there will meet LEED certification.
